1. Mark the oval on the left, above the name of your choice. 
 2. To vote for a candidate whose name is not printed on the ballot, print the name clearly in the box labeled "Write-In", staying within the box.
 3. Any mark or writing outside the spaces provided for voting may void the entire ballot.

4. To vote on a question or proposal, mark the oval below your choice.
5. The number of choices allowed is listed for each contest.
6. Do not mark the ballot for more candidates than allowed. If you do, your vote in that contest will not count.

7. If you tear, deface or wrongly mark this ballot, return it to a poll worker and obtain another. Do not attempt to correct mistakes on the ballot by making erasures or cross-outs. Erasures or cross-outs may invalidate all or part of your ballot. Prior to submitting your ballot, if you make a mistake in completing the ballot or wish to change your ballot choices, you may obtain and complete a new ballot. You have a right to a replacement ballot upon the return of the original ballot.
8. After completing your ballot, insert it into the ballot scanner and wait for the notice that your ballot has been successfully cast. If no such notice appears, seek assistance of an election inspector.
